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# Diabetes service referral

The referral of patients with diabetic related complications to a specialist outreach service provides patients with expert education aimed at promoting health and wellbeing. This education has been shown to reduce the frequency of recurring diabetic related complications.

## ndications

Diabetic services referral must be considered for all patients (irrespective of whether transported or not) with a diabetic related complication (e.g. hypo/hyperglycaemia).

## **PROCEDURE – Diabetes service referral**

- 1. Treat the patient in accordance with appropriate Clinical Practice Guidelines.
- 2. Confirm the patient is indicated for Diabetes Service Referral.
- 3. Obtain consent from the patient for their details to be provided to the relevant Queensland Health (QH) diabetes service.
- 4. Complete the diabetes referral procedure on the eARF which can be accessed in *Procedures/Consult/Refer/Diabetes Referral*.

- Ensure you document the following details in the Diabetes Referral:
  - Region
  - Current general practitioner details
- Ensure all other items are completed in the patient tab of the eARF including:

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- i) Prior medical conditions
- ii) Current medications
- iii) Patient contact details (including phone number)
- iv) Ensure the patient consents to the process
